The Professor R.S. Nigam & NPRI Freedom Scholarship

Any graduating high school student from Clark County, Nev., who will be pursuing a four-year degree program in Business, Economics, Political Science, Public Administration or a related field, at any accredited college or university may apply. Full-time and part-time employees of the Nevada Policy Research Institute, as well as children and dependents of NPRI employees, are not eligible to receive this scholarship.

Requirements

Applicants will be evaluated on the following:

- GPA: Applicants must have a minimum 3.2 cumulative GPA
- Level of volunteer, community involvement and extra-curricular activities
- Content of a two-page essay addressing the following question:

Minimum Wage: helping or hurting Nevada youth?

Recently, a group of Nevadans proposed increasing the state's minimum wage to \$13 per hour. While a minimum wage increase might help some low-wage workers, opponents to the measure argue that such an increase would make businesses less likely to hire young and inexperienced workers. What kind of effect do you think raising the minimum wage would have on Nevada youths? What pitfalls might face young workers in such an environment? Be sure to compare and contrast the effects other states have experienced from increasing their minimum wage.

- Income proof will be required if you are selected for this scholarship. Parents' combined Annual Gross Income, as shown in 2016 IRS Form 1040 line 22, should not exceed \$125,000.

For year 2017, one scholarship in the amount of \$2,500 will be awarded with a check payable directly to the student.
